300 Writers Refuse to Pay Taxes for Vietnam War Use



Thoreau's essay, published in 1849 just after the Mexican War, is called his most famous, "If a thousand men were not to pay their tax bills this year, that would not be a violent and bloody measure, as it would be to pay them and enable the


